Avoid application of Altreno to eczematous or sunburned skin.

Adult acne & the science of tretinoin

According to the American Academy of Dermatology, acne affects up to 50 million Americans each year, and the majority of adult patients seeking dermatological consultations for the treatment of acne are women. This can be especially problematic for women, because nearly four times as many women suffer from adult acne as men.^{2,3}

Prescription topical treatments that contain retinoic acids or tretinoin are often useful for acne.⁴ Tretinoin is an efficacious treatment option that is believed to work by increasing epithelial cell turnover to help clear acne.^{5†}

The exact mode of action of tretinoin in acne treatment is unknown.

Adverse Reactions: The most common adverse reactions in clinical trials were application site dryness (4%), pain (3%), erythema (2%), irritation (1%) and exfoliation (1%).

Nursing Women: It is not known whether topical administration of tretinoin could result in sufficient systemic absorption to produce detectable concentrations in human milk. The developmental health benefits of breastfeeding should be considered along with the mother's clinical need for Altreno and any potential adverse effects on the breastfed child from Altreno.
